We are pleased to see the Hemlock Dam removal project is moving forward and wish to express our interest in providing future input on the Hemlock Recreation Site.

American Whitewater is a national non-profit 501(c)(3) river conservation organization founded in 1954. We have over 6,500 members and 100 local-based affiliate clubs, representing approximately 80,000 whitewater paddlers across the nation. American Whitewater's mission is to conserve and restore America's whitewater resources and to enhance opportunities to enjoy them safely. Trout Creek and the Wind River are enjoyed by whitewater paddlers throughout the Pacific Northwest region during the winter and spring paddling seasons. Restoration of this important Columbia Gorge tributary and long-term stewardship of the river is of interest to our members in the region.

In addition to our interest in restoration of geomorphic processes and channel connectivity which will benefit steelhead, we also have an interest in the recreational benefits of a high-quality day use site along a river that will be enjoyed by our members and the general public.
